SLAM DUNK TO THE BEACH HISTORY: Slam Dunk to the Beach returns again in 2015. To properly put into perspective just how prominent a place the Lewes, DE event carved out in the basketball hierarchy, some stats are required. The tournament, which hosted some of the nation's premier players, including **LeBron James** ('01), **Dwight Howard** ('03), **Kevin Durant** ('03), and **Carmelo Anthony** ('00) was like a highway to the NBA.

Slam Dunk to the Beach featured 48 players who were drafted by NBA teams during a 10-year stretch from 1998-2007. During that time, 33 guys were taken in the opening round. If you narrow it down to a six-year stretch of drafts from 2001-2006, a remarkable 13 alumni from Slam Dunk to the Beach were chosen among the top-10 picks.

That means 22 percent of all top-10 selections during that timeframe made their way through the First State, including the second overall picks of the 2001, 2002 and 2007 drafts (**Tyson Chandler**, **Jay Williams** and **Durant**) and the top overall choices of the 2003 and 2004 drafts (**James** and **Howard**).
